What is the purpose of the survey?

This survey will help us understand the current situation regarding sun safety in primary schools in Wales and what support schools need in this area.

Why have I been invited?

You are a head teacher or another staff member at a primary school in Wales.

Do I have to take part?

No. Taking part in this study is entirely voluntary and you are under no obligation to take part – it is up to you to decide.

What do I need to do?

You are asked to complete the short online survey regarding sun safety in your school. All questions are multiple choice, and it will take less than 10 minutes to complete.

Will I get any expenses?

No, but as a token of our appreciation for completing the survey you will be entered into a draw to win £1000 for your school.

Are there any side effects or disadvantages of taking part in this study? No.

Are there any benefits to taking part in this study?

You will be helping us find out the current situation in primary schools in Wales. You will also help us understand what support schools need in this area.

Will my taking part be kept confidential?

Yes. All information you submit about your school will be kept strictly confidential. We will follow ethical and legal practice in accordance with the General Data Protection Regulations and all information will be handled in confidence. We will aggregate findings and report results anonymously.

Who has funded and organised the research?

This study is funded by Health and Care Research Wales, a research arm of the Welsh Government. It is being led by a team of researchers based in the Swansea University Medical School and Cardiff and Vale University Health Board.

What happens to the results of this survey?

The results will be analysed anonymously by the study research team. When the study is complete the results may be published in a scientific journal or presented at local, national or international meetings. No individual participants will be identified. If you would like to







obtain a copy of the published results, please indicate this on your survey.

Who has reviewed the study?

This study has been reviewed and given favourable opinion by Swansea University Medical School Research Ethics Committee on 1st February 2022.

Your data will be processed for the purposes outlined in this Information Sheet. Standard ethical procedures will involve you providing your consent to participate in this study by completing the survey.

The legal basis that we will rely on to process your data is necessary for the performance of a task carried out in the public interest. This public interest justification is approved by the Swansea University Medical School Research Ethics Committee, Swansea University.

How long will your information be held?

Data will be preserved and accessible until 5 years after project conclusion.

What are your rights?
